Additionally, he counsels wireless and new space companies, private equity firms and others on critical FCC proceedings affecting their business. Henry has represented numerous entities in enforcement proceedings at the FCC – including several successful defenses that resulted in the FCC deciding not to take action. He also counsels unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) clients on Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations.

While in law school, Henry served as a paralegal for Cooley's communications practice group. He also completed an internship at the FCC in the office of former Commissioner Robert McDowell. Before attending law school, Henry worked as an administrator at multiple higher education institutions.
